Changes! Changes! Changes!

In order to keep the NTEE-CC useful and relevant, it is necessary to periodically revise it. The NTEE-CC Oversight Committee recently approved a number of changes that are being spotlighted in this issue. All changes have been implemented; documentation will be available as follows:

June 2005 – **NTEE-CC Keyword Browser** updated

June 2005 – **NTEE-CC 2-Page summary** updated

September 2005 – **NTEE-CC 2005 Manual** published in electronic format

All new materials will be accessible on the [NCCS website](#) as soon as they become available.

Note to IRS staff: Since new codes cannot be added immediately to the IRS system, we have included instructions on which codes to use in this interim period. Look for the **aqua** text throughout this newsletter for these instructions.

A. Arts, Culture & Humanities

? Single-discipline festivals will now be coded by discipline, i.e. Shakespeare Festivals will be coded as **A65 Theater**; dance festivals will be coded as **A62 Dance**.

? **A27 Community Celebrations** has been added for multipurpose arts and culture events. Here is the complete entry:

A27 - Celebrations

Organizations that are engaged in the promotion, production or performance of community and public celebratory events.

Key words: Arts Fairs; Arts Festivals; Celebratory Events; Community Celebrations; First Nights

Scope notes: *Includes:* Arts and Street Fairs; First Night Events; and Multidiscipline Arts Festivals

Excludes: Agricultural Fairs (use Fairs N52); Ethnic Fairs & Festivals (use Cultural & Ethnic Awareness A23); Historical events (use Commemorative Events A84); Music Festivals (use Music A68); and Theater Festivals (use Theater A65).

(IRS staff should use A20 until A27 becomes available.)

? **A24 Folk Arts**, a previously disabled code, has been reinstated. Type "A24" into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for the definition and how to distinguish this code from A23.

(IRS staff should use A23 until A24 becomes available.)

? **A26 Arts Councils & Agencies** has been expanded to include Humanities Councils and has been renamed Arts & Humanities Councils & Agencies.

? **A82 Historical Societies & Historic Preservation**, a previously disabled code, has been reinstated. Type "A82" into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for the definition and how to distinguish this code from A80.

(IRS staff should use A80 until A82 becomes available.)

E. Health Care

? **E62 Emergency Medical Transport** has been expanded to include Emergency Medical Services. The name of the code has been changed to Emergency Medical Services & Transport. Type "E62" into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for complete entry.

G. Diseases, Disorders & Medical Disciplines

? **Major Group G** has been renamed Voluntary Health Organizations & Medical Disciplines.

Major Group G captures disease-specific voluntary health agencies such as the American Cancer Society and medical professional associations such as the American Academy of Optometry. Organizations whose primary purpose is to provide services to patients and their families should be classified by the type of services provided and not the disease. For example, camping programs for children with cancer should be coded as N20. Additionally, hospices for cancer patients should be classified as P74, financial assistance for cancer sufferers and their families should be coded as E86, and so on.

L. Housing & Shelter



? **L21 Public Housing** has been renamed Low-Income & Subsidized Housing.

? **L22 Senior Citizen Housing & Retirement Communities** has been revised to include all independent housing for seniors regardless of income level or other economic requirements.

? **L24 Independent Housing for People with Disabilities** has been added. Here is the complete entry:

L24 – Independent Housing for People with Disabilities

Residential options exclusively people with disabilities. Includes all HUD Supportive Housing for People with Disabilities (Section 811) properties.

Type appropriate codes into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for the complete entries for the L20s.

(IRS staff should use L21 until L24 becomes available.)

M. Public Safety, Disaster Preparedness & Relief

? **M60 Public Safety Benevolent Associations** has been added for organizations that provide relief for firefighters and/or public safety personnel and their families; similar organizations for police personnel only and their families should be coded as I60s. Here is the complete entry:

M60 - Public Safety Benevolent Associations

Organizations whose primary purpose is to support the needs of public safety agencies and their personnel.

Key words: 100 Clubs; 200 Clubs; Ambulance Crews; Emergency Medical Technicians; EMS Personnel; EMT; Firefighters; Public Safety Officers; Public Safety Personnel; Shield Clubs

Scope notes: USE for organizations benefiting public safety personnel - firefighters, police officers, EMS crews, etc. For organizations benefiting ONLY police personnel USE I60 Law Enforcement.

(IRS staff should use M99 until M60 becomes available.)

P. Human Services

? **P47 Pregnancy Centers** has been added. Here is the complete entry:

P47 – Pregnancy Centers

Organizations whose primary purpose is to provide free and confidential services to women and families facing unplanned pregnancies. Services can include pregnancy testing and physician exams with ultrasound, counseling on pregnancy-related issues, information on STDs, healthcare & community referrals, and help with material goods such as maternity and baby items.

Keywords: Birthright; Crisis Pregnancies; Crisis Pregnancy Centers, Pregnancy Centers, Pregnancy Care Centers; Pregnancy Care Clinics.

(IRS staff should use P40 until P47 becomes available.)

? **P70 Residential Care** has been renamed Residential Care & Adult Day Programs.

? **P71 Adult Day Care**, a previously disabled code, has been reinstated. Type "P71" " into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for complete entry.

(IRS staff should use P70 until P71 becomes available.)

? **P75 Senior Continuing Care Communities** has been renamed Supportive Housing for Older Adults.

? **P83 Women's Centers**, a previously disabled code, has been reinstated. Type "P83" " into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for complete entry.

(IRS staff should use P80 until P83 becomes available.)

? **P88 LGBT Centers** has been added. Here is the complete entry:

P88 - LGBT Centers

Organizations that provide or coordinate a wide variety of programs and services that meet the needs and interests of people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgendered.

(IRS staff should use P80 until P88 becomes available.)

Q. International, Foreign Affairs & National Security



? **Q22 International Student Exchange** has been renamed International Academic Exchange.

? **Q35 Democracy & Civil Society Development & Assistance** has been added. Here is the complete entry:

Q35 - International Democracy & Civil Society Development

Organizations whose primary purpose is to carry out programs that support the development of democracy and civil society in countries outside of the United States. Includes organizations that provide assistance in election planning and administration, election law development, political party development, constitutional development, and voter and civic education, which may include training of government and civic leaders. Also includes organizations that promote a supportive legal and regulatory environment for civil society and otherwise strengthen civil society actors and organizations as a group.

(IRS staff should use Q30 until Q35 becomes available.)

R. Civil Rights, Social Action & Advocacy

? **R28 Children's Rights** has been added. Here is the complete entry:

R28 - Children's Rights

Organizations that support the passage and enforcement of laws and other social measures that protect and promote the rights and interests of children and youth.

Key words: CASA; Child Advocacy; Court Appointed Special Advocates;

Scope notes: *Excludes:* Organizations that provide children's and youth services (use Children's & Youth Services P30); and organizations that deal specifically with the prevention of child abuse (use Child Abuse Prevention I72).

Examples: *Affiliate Organizations:* C.A.S.A. (Court Appointed Special Advocates)

(IRS staff should use R20 until R28 becomes available.)

T. Philanthropy, Voluntarism & Grantmaking

? **T90 Named Trusts & Foundations N.E.C.** has been renamed Named Trusts N.E.C. Code all named public foundations as Common Codes 11 or 12 in the appropriate Major Group or in the T30 decile level; code all named private foundations in the T20 decile level.

Y. Mutual & Membership Benefit

? **Y41 Fraternal Beneficiary**, a previously disabled code, has been reinstated. Type "Y41" " " into the search field of the [NTEE-CC Keyword Browser](#) for the definition and how to distinguish this code from Y40.

(IRS staff should use Y40 until Y41 becomes available.)
